

Newsletter No 2 July 2018

The whole of the Shropshire Way long distance path of 123 miles is now defined.

The southern section comprises 10 stages from Shrewsbury to Haughmond Hill with a link stage (10b) from Haughmond back to Shrewsbury. Part of stage 10a includes a new route taking the path from the Ercall through Wellington, with an extra downloadable map.



Stages 11 to 15 complete the northern section, stage 10b being used again if your start point is Shrewsbury. A diversion at Nesscliffe Camp has been approved and implemented.

All of the Southern section and most of the Northern section is waymarked.

A page for every stage of the way

Our website <u>www.shropshireway.org.uk</u> includes a new map showing all the numbered stages. There is a page for every stage with a downloadable map and a .gpx file. There are route information details for stages 1 to 10a; the others are in progress.

Shropshire Way Champions
